CSISD EDUCATION FOUNDATION

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM

The College Station ISD Education Foundation was created to support the educational programs for both the students and staff of the College Station Independent School District. Funds are used to facilitate student achievement and skill development, to recognize and encourage staff excellence and to expand community involvement from individuals, business and civic organizations.

HISTORY

- Began in 1999, with some direction from a consultant, Pete Karabatsos.
- The foundation is a non-profit, taxexempt 501©(3) public corporation operating independently under its own board of directors.
- The foundation board began with 27 board members. 5 of the original board members are still with us today.
- Raised over 1.3 million dollars over 10 years.

Grants

- The Innovative Grant Program is designed to encourage, facilitate, recognize and reward innovative and creative instructional approaches to the accomplishment of program objectives.
- Awarded over \$375,000 in grants from 1999-2009.



History Trunks Grant

- Examples of grants awarded that are now permanent programs or projects:
 - Freshman Learning Lab
 - Sophomore Learning Lab
 - "Kick it up a Notch!" awarded in 2003 is currently an ongoing Head Start project.
 - "Tiger Corn" was awarded in 2006 to the life skills class. The students sale popcorn during the day to the students.



- Scholarships
 - 121 Scholarships awarded totaling \$119,000
 - 8 Endowed Scholarships totaling \$149,139


